Meeting of the Town Board, Town of Yorktown held on August 9, 2016 at the Town Hall, 363 Underhill Avenue, Yorktown Heights, New York 10598.

#### TOWN BOARD MEETING

Supervisor Michael Grace called the meeting to order.

#### EXECUTIVE SESSION

Upon motion made by Councilman Bernard, seconded by Councilman Lachterman, the Town Board moved into Executive Session to discuss personnel and Volunteer Board Applicants.

Upon motion made by Supervisor Grace, seconded by Councilman Bernard, the Town Board moved out of Executive Session and proceeded with the meeting.

#### 1545 BAPTIST CHURCH ROAD

Environmental Consultant Bruce Barber presented the project that is being proposed. The applicant would like to tear down an existing structure and replace on that will have the same footprint. The new structure will be "bunker-style" with a grass roof and a new foundation will be poured. It has come before the board because it comes within certain footage of wetlands. Supervisor Grace stated that the project will be handled administratively and an administrative permit will be issued.

## <u>WETLAND & STORMWATER PERMIT APPLICATION – 1545 BAPTIST CHURCH ROAD</u> <u>RESOLUTION #362</u>

Upon motion made by Supervisor Grace, seconded by Councilman Diana,

Whereas, on August 9, 2016, the Town Board reviewed the 1545 Baptist Church Road application to construct a single family home in which a wetland permit and a stormwater permit is required (proposed action), and

Whereas, there is an existing home and associated improvements on the lot which shall be demolished and there shall be minimal disturbance to the site and the wetland buffer from the proposed action,

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that the Town Board of the Town of Yorktown refers this application to the Town Engineer for review and approval.

Grace, Patel, Bernard, Diana, Lachterman Voting Aye Resolution adopted.

#### PROPOSED MOHANSIC TRAILWAY

After having presented at a previous work session, the Yorktown Trail Town Committee (YTTC) in conjunction with Town Attorney Michael McDermott, established that ownership of the railroad spur is the Town's. The FDR spur is being handled separately on state property with state permission. AT&T has all the rights above ground on the easement over the

transcontinental cable and the YTTC needs to ensure that AT&T are in agreement with the project. YTTC's status has been officially designated as a non-profit with the government, and the YTCCC is requesting that the Town Board provide a resolution of support that agrees the work needs to begin September 9 in order to meet the \$16,800 Hudson Valley Greenway Conservancy grant application deadline. The projected cost to the Town, depending upon what grants are received, would be somewhere between \$3,450 and \$20,250 and approximately 43% of the total cost is volunteer labor.

Highway Superintendent Dave Paganelli asked the Town Board if they want to pass a resolution directing him to do this work. The Highway Department will have to be reimbursed when the grant is awarded. Michael McDermott mentioned that a grant of \$7,500 has already been committed and mentioned that neighbors whose property abuts the proposed trailway need to be contacted about the project.

Bruce Barber, Environmental Consultant, asked how people will cross Route 118 as part of the trail. Highway Superintendent Dave Paganelli mentioned that if this trail is to cross Route 118, the YTTC needs to be in touch with the NYS Department of Transportation to discuss establishing a crosswalk.

Supervisor Grace stated that although this is a laudable project which he would like to see come to fruition, there are many contingencies that need to be address. He stated that he does not have an issue with the YTTC exploring grant options.

### YORKTOWN TRAIL TOWN COMMITTEE GRANT APPLICATION

#### RESOLUTION #363

Upon motion made by Supervisor Grace, seconded by Councilman Bernard,

Be It Resolved, the Town Board hereby grants permission to the Yorktown Trail Town Committee to apply for a grant in the amount of \$16,700.00 from the Hudson River Valley Greenway Conservancy Trail Grant Program in connection with the proposed Mohansic Trailway along the old railroad spur from Route 118 to Baldwin Road.

Grace, Patel, Bernard, Diana, Lachterman Voting Aye Resolution adopted.

#### WOODS II

Geri Schwalb and Isabel Cavanagh from the Woods II Condominium Association came before the board to discuss ownership of a stone wall that is in disrepair, as well as a sidewalk in need of repair. The Condominium asserted that the wall was not their responsibility since it existed well before the complex was built. Supervisor Grace pointed out that the wall was on an easement, and although the wall was built prior to the condo's ownership, the property was purchased by them with the wall on it and, as such, becomes their property to maintain. Supervisor Grace said the Town will look at the sidewalk issue for structural maintenance.

## 3017 OLD YORKTOWN ROAD

Project Engineer Dan Ciarcia came before the board to present his client's project of demolishing an existing single family home and garage and replace it with a new single family home and an on-site wastewater treatment system. An existing driveway will be reconfigured. Approximately 30,000 square feet will be disturbed. Mr. Ciarcia mentioned a memo from Town Engineer Michael Quinn which refers to a Site Plan Application Checklist which Mr. Ciarcia stated is not really relevant to this project but is used for a multi-family dwelling. Typically, site plan approval is not needed for single family residences.

Supervisor Grace stated that this project will be handled by administrative permit.

### <u>STORMWATER PERMIT APPLICATION – 3017 OLD YORKTOWN ROAD</u> <u>RESOLUTION #364</u>

Upon motion made by Supervisor Grace, seconded by Councilman Bernard,

Whereas, on August 9, 2016, the Town Board reviewed the application for 3017 Old Yorktown Road to construct a single family home in which a stormwater permit is required (proposed action), and

Whereas, there is an existing home and associated improvements on the lot which shall be demolished and there shall be minimal disturbance to the site from the proposed action,

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, the Town Board of the Town of Yorktown refers this application to the Town Engineer for review and approval.

Grace, Patel, Bernard, Diana, Lachterman Voting Aye Resolution adopted.

#### 2200 SAW MILL RIVER ROAD

Peder Scott of P.W. Scott Engineering & Architecture, P.C. presented a dredging project he is working on at the residence of Mr. Brennan at 2200 Saw Mill River Road. The proposed work will required a Type 3 Non-Administrative Permit and will require a negative declaration, stormwater permit, wetlands permit, and long form environmental assessment. The project has been scheduled for the next Town Board Meeting on September 6<sup>th</sup> for the Town Board to declare Lead Agency and to send the project out on a 30 day referral. A public hearing may be set for October 18<sup>th</sup>.

#### TREE ORDINANCE

Bruce Barber, Environmental Consultant, and members of the Tree Advisory Committee presented a review of the latest version of the tree ordinance which now includes a better definition of what the forest management plan should be. A request was made by the Committee to change the celebration of Arbor Day to the last Friday in April in order to comport with the National Arbor Day, as well as the State Arbor Day.

Supervisor Grace said he would like to see the Tree Advisory Committee come up with a "tree master plan" for the town that would list potential areas for mitigation, i.e., areas that need planting or need to be cleared of invasive species, which would help define what we want to see happen in the Town.

A town resident mentioned that he would like to see severe penalties issued when a tree is not taken down when dead. He cited some examples of commercial property owners not cutting down trees which have either caused property damage to cars or caused other trees to die as a result of spreading disease.

A discussion ensured as to why the Town Board exempts town-owned property from this ordinance. Supervisor Grace stated that he is looking to the Tree Advisory Committee for direction as to what the Town needs and how this can be worked into mitigation plans. Supervisor Grace stated that, going forward, he would like to empower the Tree Advisory Committee to really be able to accomplish something. Councilman Bernard said the town would have to be careful of liability using mitigation as a way to clean up trees that need to be cut down on town property.

Suggestions made to the ordinance will be incorporated into a revised ordinance and a public hearing has been set for the September 20, 2016 board meeting.
