front door, the original "boarding rock" still remains, providing a convenient step down to the ground for passengers in horse drawn carriages. A sensitive renovation in the early 2000s brought the home into the 21st century with updated systems and central air-conditioning, but carefully preserved the home's wide-board floors, exposed hand hewn beams, and four original fireplaces with carved surrounds.

As an architect, David Graham immediately appreciated the history of his home and the purity with which it had been maintained. He admits that old houses require care and vigilance, but, even the significant expense of a much-needed and soon-to-be-added new roof for the venerable "Flowerdale" has not dimmed his enthusiasm for living in a piece of Yorktown's history.

The Yorktown Landmarks Preservation Commission (YLPC) is always seeking applicants for traditional Landmarking or the Homes of Historic Distinction Program. To qualify, homes must have historical significance based on age, architectural style, past ownership, or association with a person or event important to Yorktown's history. Through the program, plaques designating the basic facts about each house's history are fabricated and installed on or around the home. YLPC will work with each homeowner on appropriate wording for the plaque and will assist in research. The cost for the application and the plaque is \$100.
