11. Mobile Audio Tour Guide

Desired Result

-Develop a digital mobile narrated audio tour guide to navigate and discover the historical significance of each point of interest of the story

Approach

-develop the information requirements (what is the story to be told—text, audio), accompanying videos, still photographs, and other resource links

-solicit proposals from digital application vendors

-conduct a test of a digital application vendor with a small subset of sites

Progress

- -conducted preliminary interviews with four potential vendors: The Clio, Otocast, Lantern Audio, TravelStorysGPS
- -topline initial assessment:
- ...The Clio-limited "smart functionality"; more like a Wikipedia for points of interest, WCHS choice, makes sense to add profiles for the Andre/Arnold points of interest to The Clio
- ...Otocast-Ossining based, robust function, 200 tours around US, reasonable cost
- ...LanternVideo-W3R application, broker, looks for best fit, very expensive
- ...TravelStorysGPS-produce local projects and familiarity, but very very expensive
- -Yorktown Heritage Preservation Commission / Yorktown 250 funding \$2500 to plan, develop and test digital audio tour, Up to 14 historic sites in Yorktown including the three Andre-Arnold sites

Otocast (Test Vendor)

Product: Audio guides for arts, culture and history locations, indoor and outdoor; platform to drive a variety of experience in the arts & culture space (audio, recording, script writing, editing)

Deliverable: create a digital audio tour of historic points of interest on the Andre – Arnold journey

-each point of interest spot contains audio, text, embedded video links, map, photos, Google analytics; tour also available at website page mirroring the points of interest

Cost: Initial setup / configuration: \$125 per point of interest x 50 points of interest =\$6250 plus annual maintenance \$60 per point of interest=\$3K for 24x7 support

Test: sub set: estimated 14 points of interest in Yorktown=\$2500, \$900 annual maintenance

We plan to use The CLIO (county application) to build the input profiles (Wikipedia like) and post at County as well-- then use Otocast as smart application for tour
