<u>Authorize Supervisor to enter into a license agreement with Greg and Alana</u> <u>Millings to enter upon Town Property and remove 30 feet of natural growth at</u> <u>their expense</u>

RESOLVED, the Supervisor is authorized to enter into a license agreement with Greg Millings and Alana Millings to enter upon Town Property and remove, at their sole cost and expense, approximately (30) feet of natural growth running perpendicularly beyond the boundary between the Millings' Premises and Town Property and to install shrubbery around the property line to act as a natural screen and buffer.

<u>Requests that the N.Y.S. Department of Transportation perform an analysis of the intersection of Route 35 and Quaker Church Road</u>

RESOLVED, that the Town desires and requests that the N.Y.S. Department of Transportation perform an analysis of the intersection of Route 35 and Quaker Church Road to determine if a traffic signal is warranted.

<u>Town of Yorktown does not desire to eliminate the N.Y. R.P.T.L. 487 exemption</u> <u>from taxation for certain energy systems regulated under that Section</u>

RESOLVED, that the Town of Yorktown does not desire to eliminate the N.Y. R.P.T.L. 487 exemption from taxation for certain energy systems regulated under that section, but will instead require the owner or developer of such systems to enter into a contract for payments in lieu of taxes.

Authorize recycling bins to be placed in all Town-owned buildings, common areas and employee work stations

RESOLVED, that in all Town-owned buildings, to the extent safe and practical, a recycling bin shall be placed wherever there is a trash bin, including in common areas (e.g., copy rooms) and at every employee workstation.

Authorize Chief of Police to execute a Use and Dissemination Agreement with the NYS Division of Criminal Justice for the access to criminal history and wanted and/or missing persons data

RESOLVED, that the Chief of Police is authorized to execute a Use and Dissemination Agreement with the N.Y.S. Division of Criminal Justice Services, for the access to criminal history and wanted and/or missing persons data.

Authorize Town Clerk to advertise Request for Proposals for providing food and refreshment service at the Yorktown Heights Railroad Station in Railroad Park

Resolved, that the Town Clerk is authorized to advertise a Request for Proposals from qualified proposers interested in providing high quality, reasonably priced food and refreshment service (snack bar service) at the Yorktown Heights Railroad Station in Railroad Park located at 1862 Commerce Street in Yorktown Heights, NY.

Accept Landscape and Site Improvement Bond from AVS Food, Inc. for Popeyes Restaurant

WHEREAS, Vijay Singh, of AVS Food Inc., owner of Popeyes Restaurant, has

completed site work for the project known as Popeyes at Staples Plaza, approved by Planning Board Resolution #18-18 dated October 15, 2018; and

WHEREAS, due to winter conditions the applicant is not able to complete on-site landscaping and a few other minor site improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Popeyes Restaurant owner has informed the Yorktown Planning Board and the Planning Board determined that, to insure the installation of the on-site landscaping and other minor site improvements, the applicant must post a cash bond; and

WHEREAS, the amount of the cash bond has been determined to be in the amount of \$20,000.00; and

WHEREAS, AVS Food, Inc. has provided the Town with check# 1095 in the amount of \$20,000.00, to serve as the required cash bond; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the monies required prior to issuance of the Certificate of Occupancy for the project known as Popeyes at Staples Plaza have been tendered to the Town and that the Town Comptroller is authorized to accept the above-referenced project bond for the purposes stated herein.

Direct Town Assessor to continue temporary suspension and Modification of laws relating to the Pandemic Disaster Emergency, specifically as it pertains to Senior and Disability Exemptions, Section 467 and 459C of the Real Property Tax Law to grant Exemptions on the 2021 Assessment Roll

WHEREAS, on March 7, 2020, Andrew M. Cuomo, Governor of the State of New York issued Executive Order Number 202, declaring a State disaster emergency for the entire State of New York; and

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 202.83, a portion of which includes a local option pertaining to Senior Citizens' and Persons with Disabilities' partial property tax exemption, Subdivisions 7, 7-a and 8 of Section 459-c of the Real Property Tax Law (Partial Tax Exemption for Persons with Disabilities), and Subdivisions 5, 5-a, 5-b, 5-c and 6 of Section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law (Partial Tax Exemption for Low Income Senior Citizens), to the extent necessary to permit the governing body of an assessing unit to adopt a resolution directing the assessor to grant exemptions pursuant to such section on the 2021 assessment roll to all property owners who received either of those exemption on the 2020 assessment roll, unless there has been a change in status that would no longer qualify the homeowner, dispensing with the need for renewal applications from such persons, and further dispensing with the requirement for assessors to mail renewal applications to such persons; and

WHEREAS, the Town is desirous to adopt such resolution while also allowing the assessor to require a renewal application to be filed when the assessor has reason to

believe that an owner who qualified for the exemption on the 2020 assessment roll may have since changed primary residence, added another owner to the deed, transferred the property to a new owner, or died;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Town Board of the Town of Yorktown directs the Town Assessor, pursuant to the NYS Governor's Executive Order 202.83 Continuing Temporary Suspension and Modification of Laws relating to the pandemic disaster emergency, specifically as it pertains to Senior and Disability Exemptions, Section 467 and 459c of the Real Property Tax Law, to grant exemptions on the 2021 Assessment Roll to all property owners who received that exemption on the 2020 Assessment Roll, except in the case that there is a change of status that would no longer qualify the homeowner, thereby dispensing with the need for renewal applications from such persons, and further dispensing with the requirement for assessors to mail renewal applications to such persons.

Accept Audit of Yorktown Justice Court for fiscal year 2019

Resolved, that the audit of the Town of Yorktown Justice Court prepared by PKF O'Connor Davies, LLP, for the fiscal year 2019, submitted to the Town on December 23, 2020 be and is hereby accepted by the Town Board. A copy of the audit is filed with the Town Clerk and available for public inspection.

10. ORGANIZATIONAL RESOLUTIONS

Salaries

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be hereby authorized and directed to pay salaries of all elected and appointed Town officials and employees without prior audit.

Mileage Rate

RESOLVED, that the rate of 56 cents per mile be allowed to those Town officials and employees who use their own automobiles in the performance of their official duties in accordance with the budgetary appropriations, provided however, the expense incurred is presented to the Town Board in the proper manner and on the proper claim form.

Blanket Authority to Sign Contracts

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby grants blanket authority to sign contracts for the Town, without the necessity of express advance approval by the Town Board to the Supervisor in the event the contract involves any expenditure of not more than \$12,500, not to exceed \$50,000 in any calendar year and is limited to one year in duration and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that this blanket authorization shall remain in effect until amended.

Fiscal Report Filing to State Comptroller

RESOLVED, that by the authority vested pursuant to Paragraph 10-a of Section 29 of the Town Law, the Supervisor shall submit to the Town Clerk within one hundred

twenty days after the close of the fiscal year, a copy of the report to the State Comptroller required by Section 30 of the General Municipal Law and the Town Clerk shall cause a summary of such report to be published within 10 days after receipt thereof in a form approved by the State Comptroller.

Comptroller to Refund Certain Corrections of Error

RESOLVED, that the Comptroller is appointed, as per Section 554 of the Real Property Tax Law to make refunds for correction of error up to a maximum of \$2,500.00.

New York State Division of Youth State Aid Recreation/Youth Services Project

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be directed to make application to the New York State Division of Youth for State Aid for a Recreation and Youth Service Project Grant for 2021. The Parks and Recreation Department receives \$10,000 of this application for youth recreation, and the Police Department receives another \$10,000 for the Youth Officer.

Authorize Supervisor to sign Agreement with Nor-West

Authorize the Supervisor to sign an agreement with Nor-West for therapeutic recreational programs.

Authorize Supervisor to sign Agreement with Sports Clubs

Authorize the Supervisor to sign an agreement with the following Sports Clubs: Shrub Oak Athletic Club Yorktown Athletic Club

Authorize Supervisor to sign Agreement with Senior Clubs
