Flag Day

WHEREAS, the American flag represents our nation and values of freedom, equality, justice and hope; and

WHEREAS, when the American Revolution began in 1775, the colonists did not fight under one unifying flag but under their own flags; and

WHEREAS, on June 14, 1777, the Second Continental Congress passed a resolution stating that "the flag of the United States shall be 13 stripes, alternate

red and white," and that "the Union be 13 stars, white on a blue field, representing a new constellation"; and

WHEREAS, President Woodrow Wilson marked the 100th anniversary of the resolution establishing the flag by declaring June 14th as Flag Day; and

WHEREAS, the American flag has inspired Americans on the battlefield, has provided comfort during times of war and peace, and has stood as a symbol of hope for the millions of people who have come to America seeking better lives; NOW, THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Town of Yorktown recognizes June 14, 2021 as Flag Day and encourages its residents to proudly display this important symbol throughout the year.

Juneteenth Day

WHEREAS, Juneteenth is recognized as the oldest nationally celebrated commemoration of the ending of slavery in the United States; and

WHEREAS, President Abraham Lincoln first issued the Emancipation Proclamation effective January 1, 1863, freeing the slaves in the South, however, southern slave owners ignored that order. On June 19th, 1865, Union soldiers arrived in Galveston, Texas and enforced the president's order, freeing the slaves two and a half years after it was first decreed. This day has since come to be known as Juneteenth; and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth has been also titled "Jun-Jun," "Freedom Day," Emancipation Day," and Emancipation Celebration;" and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth celebrations have been held to honor African-American freedom while encouraging self-development, education and respect for all cultures; and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth will be recognized at this year's Summerfest hosted by the Yorktown Chamber of Commerce and Town of Yorktown;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town of Yorktown proclaims June 19th as Juneteenth Day in recognition of June 19, 1865, the date on which Union soldiers ended slavery in Galveston, Texas; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED, The Town of Yorktown reiterates its stance against all forms of oppression, racism and bigotry; and

FUTHER BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town of Yorktown supports the continued nationwide celebration of Juneteenth Day to provide an opportunity for the people of the United States to learn more about the past and to better understand the experiences that have shaped this nation.

Convene Public Hearing for the proposed Establishment of the Hallocks Mill Sewer District Extension

Supervisor Matthew Slater will convene a public hearing on the petition, together with a map showing the boundaries of a proposed sewer district extension in said Town, to be known as Hallocks Mill Sewer District Extension in the Town of Yorktown (the "Extension") a general plan to serve said Extension, and a report of the proposed method of operation thereof; and

WHEREAS, said map, plan and report were prepared by a competent engineer duly licensed by the State of New York, and have been filed in the office of the Town Clerk of said Town, where the same are available during regular office hours for examination by any persons interested in the subject matter thereof, including estimate of cost; and

WHEREAS, the boundaries of said Extension shall be as described in Exhibit A attached hereto and hereby incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the improvements proposed consist of the construction of a sanitary sewer system at a maximum estimated cost of \$14,300,000; and

WHEREAS, the cost of hook-up fees to the typical property in said Extension is \$5,850; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost of said Extension to the typical property therein is \$1,494 in the first year in which operation, maintenance, debt service and other charges and expenses are to be paid (\$782 for a typical property not connected); and

WHEREAS, a detailed explanation of the manner by which such costs were computed has been filed in the office of the Town Clerk where the same are available during regular office hours for examination by any person interested in the subject matter thereof.

Authorize Supervisor to enter into an Intermunicipal Agreement with the Yorktown Central School District for use of School District facilities, vehicles and equipment

RESOLVED, the Supervisor is authorized to enter into an Intermunicipal Agreement with the Yorktown Central School District for the purpose of allowing the Town of Yorktown, to use the School District's facilities, vehicles and equipment and for the Yorktown Central School District to use the Town's facilities, vehicles and equipment, for the benefit of the residents of the Town of Yorktown and the Yorktown Central School District. The term of the Agreement shall be from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022.

Authorize Supervisor to enter into an amendment to the Agreement with Ciarcia Engineering. P.C. for on-call Engineering Services

WHEREAS, the Town Board is desirous of supporting the Town's special needs community by enhancing services, raising awareness and coordinating support;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby creates an Accessibilities Committee for the purpose of: (1) advising the Town Board on how best to support the special needs community in the Town; (2) raise awareness of and coordinate support for special needs residents; (3) enhance services to the special needs community and their families; (4) coordinate support of the special needs community and their families; and (5) help craft more inclusive policies;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Committee shall consist of at least five (5) volunteer members; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that each Committee member shall be appointed by and serve at the discretion of the Town Board; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Committee shall select its own Chairperson; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all Committee meetings will be open to the public, the public will be permitted to participate in the Committee's discussions, and the Committee's meeting dates are to be posted on the Town's website; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that detailed minutes will be prepared of all Committee meetings;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Committee shall submit a report, on or before the 31st day of January, setting forth for the prior calendar year: (1) the dates the Committee met, (2) all votes taken by the Committee, (3) all memoranda prepared by the Committee and submitted to the Town Board, (4) all activities undertaken by the Committee, and (5) all minutes of the Committee's meetings; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Thomas Panek and Kathleen Macias-Torres are hereby appointed as members of the Committee with terms to expire on December 31, 2022.

Authorize Supervisor to execute an Inter-Municipal Agreement ("IMA") with the County of Westchester to grant the County a license, permit and easement in order to allow the County to connect to the Town-owned sanitary sewer system for property located at 3840 Crompond Road

WHEREAS, the Supervisor is authorized to execute an Inter-Municipal Agreement ("IMA") with the County of Westchester to grant the County a license, permit and easement in order to allow the County property located at 3840 Crompond Road, Cortlandt Manor, New York ("County Property") to connect to the Town-owned sanitary sewer system ("Town District"), a portion of which is located along Route 202 (Crompond Road), and

Whereas, in consideration for the privilege of connecting to and discharging sanitary sewage from the County Property into the Town District's sanitary sewer during the term of this Permit, the County agrees and covenants to pay a fee equivalent to what the County would pay if the Town was able to levy a sewer tax against the County Property, and the County would also be subject to payment of its share of debt service for any capital improvements made to the Town District during the term of the Agreement, and

WHEREAS, <u>Town Law §64</u> requires that the Town's conveyance of real property be subject to a permissive referendum under <u>Town Law §90</u> and <u>91</u>; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town has determined the action contemplated under this Resolution is a Type II action under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQR") and therefore no further review is required under SEQR; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, the Town Board hereby directs that a copy of this resolution be filed with the Town Clerk and a copy be provided to any person who has requested a copy hereof; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to NY Town Law §82 and 90, within ten (10) days from the date of this Resolution the Town Clerk shall post and publish a notice which shall set forth the date of the adoption of the Resolution, shall contain an abstract of such Resolution concisely setting forth the purpose and effect thereof, shall specify that this Resolution was adopted subject to a permissive referendum; and shall publish such notice in The Yorktown News, a newspaper published in the County having a general circulation in the Town of Yorktown, and in addition thereto that the Town Clerk shall post or cause to be posted on the sign-board of the Town of Yorktown, a copy of such notice within ten (10) days after the date of the adoption of this Resolution.

WHEREAS, Andrew Ryder as applicant in 2016 for a land development project consisting of two lots, one on Hunterbrook Road, the other on Crompond Road, posted check #181 in the amount of \$2,500 to serve as the Wetland Bond and check #182 in the amount of \$1,500 to serve as the Erosion Control Bond (totaling \$4,000) for permit #WP-FSWPPP-062-15, which was deposited to the T33 account on August 29, 2016.

WHEREAS, Andrew Ryder sold the property to JAB Builders in March of 2018 and the bonds were assigned to JAB Builders the new owners of the property.

WHEREAS, John Barile, President and applicant of JAB Builders posted Check No. 1992 in the amount of \$5,000, which was deposited into the T33 account on January 31, 2020, to serve as the project Performance Bond for Landscaping.

WHEREAS, John Barile, President of JAB Builders and as applicant has requested all monies be released and a final inspection be performed as the project work is now complete.

WHEREAS, a site inspection was performed and determined that the Erosion Control Bond and the Performance Bond may be returned as all disturbed areas have been restored.

WHEREAS, The Wetland Bond cannot be returned as the three-year time period for growth of plantings has not been satisfied.
