TOWN BOARD MEETING

Supervisor Matthew Slater called the meeting to order.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Upon motion made by Councilman Diana, seconded by Councilman Lachterman, the Town Board moved into Executive Session to discuss individual personnel issues, as well as litigation and negotiations. Upon motion made by Councilman Diana, seconded by Councilman Lachterman, the Town Board moved out of Executive Session and proceeded with the meeting.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Councilman Patel led the Pledge of Allegiance.

MOMENT OF SILENCE

Supervisor Slater asked for a moment of silence to remember the Mills family – former Yorktown Police Officer Pete Mills passed away this afternoon. Officer Mills had a 35-year career as a police officer in Yorktown.

INTRODUCTIONS

Supervisor Slater introduced members of the Town Board, as well as Town Clerk Diana Quast, Town Attorney Adam Rodriguez, and Highway Superintendent Dave Paganelli.

REPORTS FROM THE TOWN SUPERVISOR

Supervisor Slater reported on recent Town events and updates, including the following:

- COVID Update
- Special Meeting of the Town Board being held tomorrow to hold interviews as a result of the RFP for environmental consultant. The Town Board will immediately vote to go into Executive Session.
- Parkland Alienation for the HESP Solar Project at Granite Knolls Sports Complex was approved by the State Legislature.
- Grant for the adaptive playground at Granite Knolls was approved and has been signed by the Town Supervisor.

Members of the Town Council reported on recent Town events and public service announcements.

REPORT FROM THE HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT

Highway Superintendent Dave Paganelli gave an update on the work the Highway Department is doing in Town. He asked that residents notify his department of any issues, particularly sight-line issues.

PROCLAMATIONS

Supervisor Slater read the following proclamation:

PROCLAMATION - FLAG DAY

Upon motion made by Councilman Diana, seconded by Councilwoman Roker,

WHEREAS, the American flag represents our nation and values of freedom, equality, justice and hope; and

WHEREAS, when the American Revolution began in 1775, the colonists did not fight under one unifying flag but under their own flags; and

WHEREAS, on June 14, 1777, the Second Continental Congress passed a resolution stating that "the flag of the United States shall be 13 stripes, alternate red and white," and that "the Union be 13 stars, white on a blue field, representing a new constellation"; and

WHEREAS, President Woodrow Wilson marked the 100th anniversary of the resolution establishing the flag by declaring June 14th as Flag Day; and

WHEREAS, the American flag has inspired Americans on the battlefield, has provided comfort during times of war and peace, and has stood as a symbol of hope for the millions of people who have come to America seeking better lives; NOW, THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Town of Yorktown recognizes June 14, 2021 as Flag Day and encourages its residents to proudly display this important symbol throughout the year.

Councilwoman Roker read the following resolution:

PROCLAMATION - JUNETEENTH DAY

Upon motion made by Councilman Diana, seconded by Councilwoman Roker,

WHEREAS, Juneteenth is recognized as the oldest nationally celebrated commemoration of the ending of slavery in the United States; and

WHEREAS, President Abraham Lincoln first issued the Emancipation Proclamation effective January 1, 1863, freeing the slaves in the South, however, southern slave owners ignored that order. On June 19th, 1865, Union soldiers arrived in Galveston, Texas and enforced the president's order, freeing the slaves two and a half years after it was first decreed. This day has since come to be known as Juneteenth; and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth has been also titled "Jun-Jun," "Freedom Day," Emancipation Day," and Emancipation Celebration;" and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth celebrations have been held to honor African-American freedom while encouraging self-development, education and respect for all cultures; and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth will be recognized at this year's Summerfest hosted by the Yorktown Chamber of Commerce and Town of Yorktown;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town of Yorktown proclaims June 19th as Juneteenth Day in recognition of June 19, 1865, the date on which Union soldiers ended slavery in Galveston, Texas; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED, The Town of Yorktown reiterates its stance against all forms of oppression, racism and bigotry; and

FUTHER BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town of Yorktown supports the continued nationwide celebration of Juneteenth Day to provide an opportunity for the people of the United States to learn more about the past and to better understand the experiences that have shaped this nation.

PRESENTATION TRAILTOWN – MOHEGAN QUARRY

Jonathan Nettlefield and Susan Siegel from the Yorktown Trailtown Committee came before the Board to share with everyone their latest project, which is documenting a little-known part of Yorktown's industrial history – the Mohegan Granite Quarry – located in Sylvan Glen. Mr. Nettlefield shared his screen in order to display photos of the park at Sylvan Glen and photos of the quarry while Ms. Siegel gave a brief history of the Mohegan Granite Quarry. Photos were also shown of significant memorials and buildings made from the local granite. Mr. Nettlefield also displayed pictures of what the signage would look like at the site.

The following people spoke during Courtesy of the Floor:

- Susan Siegel, resident, spoke on behalf of the Committee for a Sound Plan for Soundview. She said that the Committee is not against the proposed overlay law but has concerns about how the Town plans to comply with the SEQRA environmental review of the law's potential impact.
- John Flynn, resident, commented on the overlay legislation that would allow higher density projects in various parts of Yorktown. He spoke about Mr. Fish's (Town Consultant) review that was presented last week. Mr. Flynn said his experience tells him that the areas in question would have many significant impacts beyond schools and traffic (i.e., environmental).

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on June 15, 2021 pursuant to notice duly published, as required by law, to consider a proposed Local Law amending Chapter 275 of the Town Code entitled "Vehicles and Traffic" by amending Section 275-6(A) by adding full stops at the following locations:

CONVENE PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER A SITE PLAN AMENDMENT APPLICATION SUBMITTED BY WASHINGTON PRIME GROUP FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW 2,446 SQUARE FOOT EXTERIOR PATIO AT THE JEFFERSON VALLEY MALL

Supervisor Matthew Slater convened a public hearing to consider a Site Plan Amendment application submitted by Washington Prime Group for the construction of a new 2,446 square foot exterior patio at the Jefferson Valley Mall. Supervisor Slater introduced Stephen Harris and Alexa O'Rourke from the Washington Prime Group.

Town Clerk Diana Quast displayed the Affidavit of Publication for the public hearing.

Mr. Harris reviewed a presentation he made at a previous Town Board work session to show where they proposed to have the exterior patio. He and Ms. O'Rourke spoke of the benefits this addition to the mall would provide to the mall and the public.

Planning Director John Tegeder asked about seating for the patio and was told there is no seating plan, as yet, but they would not exceed what is allowed by law. Mr. Tegeder said a final set of plans would need to be signed by the Supervisor before they could obtain their building permit.

He repeated that the signing of the site plan would not happen until a seating plan was provided.

No member of the public spoke.

Upon motion made by Councilwoman Roker, seconded by Councilman Lachterman, the public hearing was closed.

WHEREAS, a public hearing was convened on Tuesday, June 15, 2021 to consider a Site Plan amendment application submitted by Washington Prime Group for the construction of a new 2,446 square foot exterior patio at the Jefferson Valley Mall,

CONVENE PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE PROPOSED ESTABLISHMENT OF THE HALLOCKS MILL SEWER DISTRICT EXTENSION

Supervisor Matthew Slater convened a public hearing on the petition, together with a map showing the boundaries of a proposed sewer district extension in said Town, to be known as Hallocks Mill Sewer District Extension in the Town of Yorktown (the "Extension") a general plan to serve said Extension, and a report of the proposed method of operation thereof; and

WHEREAS, said map, plan and report were prepared by a competent engineer duly licensed by the State of New York, and have been filed in the office of the Town Clerk of said Town, where the same are available during regular office hours for examination by any persons interested in the subject matter thereof, including estimate of cost; and

WHEREAS, the boundaries of said Extension shall be as described in $\underline{\text{Exhibit A}}$ attached hereto and hereby incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the improvements proposed consist of the construction of a sanitary sewer system at a maximum estimated cost of \$14,300,000; and

WHEREAS, the cost of hook-up fees to the typical property in said Extension is \$5,850; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost of said Extension to the typical property therein is \$1,494 in the first year in which operation, maintenance, debt service and other charges and expenses are to be paid (\$782 for a typical property not connected); and

WHEREAS, a detailed explanation of the manner by which such costs were computed has been filed in the office of the Town Clerk where the same are available during regular office hours for examination by any person interested in the subject matter thereof.

Town Clerk Diana Quast displayed the Affidavit of Publication for the public hearing.

Town Engineering Consultant Dan Ciarcia showed a presentation of Phase 1 of the Hallocks Mill Sewer District Extension Project. Information included:

- District Overview (number of parcels, number of parcels connects and unsewered parcels)
- Phase 1 Sewer Extensions (selected sub areas; total of 315 parcels, criteria for selecting the areas)
- Project Summary (estimated cost \$14,300,000; NYCDEP East of Hudson fund contribution \$10,000,000). The amount to be bonded \$4,300,000 for 30 years.
- Tax Summary (Capital Cost, Sewage Treatment Tax, Sewer Rent Charge) total \$1,494 once connected
- Next Steps

Sharon Robinson, Engineering Consultant, said the estimate was one that was developed a few years ago, and additional funding, interest changes, etc. may raise or lower the estimate.

The following members of the public spoke:

- Kathryn McGowan, resident, asked about the time frame for the project (from start to finish)
- Ed Ciffone, resident, said he is one of the many who is not going to get the sewer connection. He said that he does not want the sewer because he cannot afford the added costs. Mr. Ciffone asked about the petition process and its results. Ms. Robinson and Mr. Ciarcia responded to Mr. Ciffone's questions.
- Eileen Burke, resident, said she is happy the project is moving forward given the money she spends yearly on cleaning her septic system. Ms. Burke asked about federal funding. The Town Board and Supervisor Slater responded to her question.

All those present having been given the opportunity to be heard and there being no further discussion, the hearing was adjourned until July 6, 2021. Upon motion made by Councilman Diana, seconded by Councilwoman Roker, and carried.
