TOWN BOARD

AUTHORIZE APPOINTMENT OF WILLIAM P. HARRINGTON OF BLEAKLEY PLATT & SCHMIDT AS SPECIAL COUNSEL

RESOVED, that the Town hereby appoints William P. Harrington, of Bleakley Platt & Schmidt, LLP, as Special Counsel to investigate and report upon the circumstances that led to the disclosure to the public of a Town Ethics Board Recommendation, review the process by which the Ethics Board conducts investigations and performs similar functions, review the ethics code to provide recommendations to enhance said code, and all matters incidental thereto, which the Town Board finds to be in the Town's best interests.

WATER DEPARTMENT

AUTHORIZE THE YORKTOWN CONSOLIDATED WATER DISTRICT TO COMMENCE WITH THE CLEANING AND RELINING OF THE CAST IRON WATER MAINS IN PRIORITY AREAS

WHEREAS, the Town of Yorktown entered into an agreement on June 3, 2014 with Weston & Sampson, PE, LS, LA, PC to perform engineering services pertaining to the cleaning and cement relining project, pursuant to a Cost Proposal dated March 20, 2014, for a total cost of \$66,900; and

WHEREAS, the existing contract has a remaining balance of \$44,900; and

WHEREAS, the Yorktown Consolidated Water District intends to move forward in 2021 with the cleaning and relining of the cast iron water main within identified priority areas;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, upon recommendation of the Distribution Superintendent, the Town Board authorizes the Supervisor to sign the necessary contracts in order to enter into an agreement with Weston & Sampson, PE, LS, LA, PC for engineering services related to the bidding and construction of Cleaning & Cement Relining Water Mains project at specific locations within the Yorktown Consolidated Water District for an estimated fee of \$35,900.

PLANNING DEPARTMENT

AUTHORIZE A TRAFFIC STUDY BY SAM SCHWARTZ ENGINEERING, DPC FOR THE TACO BELL RESTAURANT IN THE ROUTE 6 OFFICE DEVELOPMENT AT ROUTE 6 AND MOHEGAN AVENUE IN MOHEGAN LAKE

WHEREAS, the Planning Board of the Town of Yorktown desires to study the traffic impact of the proposed site plan known as Taco Bell Restaurant located in the Route 6 Office Development, proposed on the southwest corner side of Route 6 and Mohegan Avenue; and

WHEREAS, Sam Schwartz Engineering, DPC, a traffic consulting firm, has entered into an agreement with the Town of Yorktown to provide these services on an on-call basis which was authorized by the Town Board by resolution on June 8, 2021; and

WHEREAS, Sam Schwartz Engineering, DPC has submitted a proposal to provide the traffic analysis for the site plan pursuant to said on-call agreement for an amount not to exceed \$5,000.00 for the traffic analysis; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Supervisor of the Town of Yorktown is hereby authorized to engage Sam Schwartz Engineering, DPC under the on-call agreement with the Town of Yorktown for the purpose of analyzing the traffic impacts of the commercial site plan know as Taco Bell Restaurant, located on the Route 6 Office Development, in an amount not to exceed \$5,000.00 for the traffic analysis, and that the total cost shall be paid for by the applicant as part of the cost of the application's review.
