Supervisor Michael Grace called the meeting to order

Upon motion made by Councilwoman Siegel, seconded by Councilman Patel, the Town Board moved into Executive Session to discuss the employment of particular people. Upon motion made by Councilwoman Siegel, seconded by Councilman Patel, to proceed with the Town Board meeting.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Councilman elect Gregory Bernard and Councilman elect Thomas Diana led the salute to the flag.

MOMENT OF SILENCE

A moment of silence was observed in honor of our men and women serving in the Armed Forces.

<u>DURING REPORTS FROM TOWN SUPERVISOR</u>, Supervisor Michael Grace congratulated Councilman-Elect Gregory Bernard and Councilman-Elect Thomas Diana on their win in the March 10, 2015 Special Election. He also thanked Robert Giordano and Rosanne Brackett for their participation in the election.

<u>DURING REPORTS FROM TOWN COUNCIL</u>, Councilwoman Susan Siegel spoke about a number of issues including, the Freedom on Information Law, the Spectra-Energy AIM Pipeline Expansion Project and a bill that is being sponsored in the Assembly that would create a sober living residence task force. Councilman Patel also stated that dental floss should never be disposed of in a sewer.

Mr. Paul Moskowitz, Michael Kaplowitz, Chairman of the Westchester County Board of Legislators, Mr. Edward Ciffone and Mrs. Lisa MacKay.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

CREATE HUNTERBROOK SEWER DISTRICT #20

Supervisor Grace convened a public hearing to consider the establishment of the Hunterbrook Sewer District Extension No. 20, and the improvements proposed therefor, and to consider the petition, map, plan and report filed in relation thereto, and to hear all persons interested in the subject matter thereof concerning the same, and for such other action on the part of said Town Board as may be required by law or shall be proper in the premises.

Mr. Albert Capellini, the Attorney for the applicant stated that Hunterbrook Ext. 20 would be comprised of 8 residential properties and 4 commercial properties. The developer of the Costco property will pay for the construction of this sewer district.

Mr. Chris Hanzlik, a Consultant with TRC Engineers gave an overview of the project.

Supervisor Grace read emails from the following homeowners, Mujaj and Agim Cyme, James and Ann Kutter, Gilbert Claudio and Elizabeth Martinez, Edmund Chan, Renee Falk and Alfio Della Vecchia, all asking the Town Board to approve this sewer district.

Mr. Paul Moskowitz, read a prepared statement, a copy of which is on file in the Town Clerk's Office. The statement which looks at flows from the Hunterbrook Pump Station between February, 2014 and September, 2014.questions whether this project could be accommodated.

Mrs. Olivia Buehl said while there is adequate space in the Peekskill Sanitary Sewer District to accommodate this project, she questioned if there was adequate space in the Hunterbrook Pump Station.

Mrs. Sharon Robinson, Acting Town Engineer stated that she is not sure of what documents the two previous speakers were looking at. But, the Hunterbrook Pump Station has more than enough capacity for this project.

Mrs. Ann Kutter stated that 100% of the property owners who would be effected by this sewer district have signed the petition. She asked the Town Board to approve this local sewer district.

Ms. Babette Ballinger questioned what is being done for people who live in other areas of Yorktown who do not have sewers.

Mr. Benjamin Fall, a resident of the area stated that he came before this Board a long time ago asking for sewers.

Mr. Dan Ciarcia, the former Town Engineer spoke about the analyses his department made before this sewer district was formed. The Hunterbrook Sewer District has the capacity to accommodate this project. When we looked at areas that would be serviced by this sewer district, several residential developments, which will never be built were factored into this sewer district.

All those present having been given the opportunity to be heard and there being no further discussion, upon motioned by Councilwoman Siegel, and seconded by Councilman Patel the public hearing was closed.
