TOWN BOARD MEETING

Supervisor Michael Grace called the meeting to order.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Upon motion made by Supervisor Grace, seconded by Councilwoman Siegel, the Town Board moved into Executive Session to discuss the employment of a particular person.

Upon motion made by Supervisor Grace, seconded by Councilman Bernard, the Town Board moved out of Executive Session and proceeded with the meeting.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Supervisor Grace led the salute to the flag.

MOMENT OF SILENCE

A moment of silence was observed in honor of our men and women serving in the Armed Forces and the people of Paris.

<u>DURING REPORTS TO THE TOWN</u>, Supervisor Grace congratulated former Councilman Anthony Grasso who will be inducted into the Westchester County Senior Hall of Fame on December 4, 2015.

DURING REPORTS FROM THE TOWN COUNCIL,

Councilwoman Siegel spoke on several topics including the issuance of a new SPEDES Permit for the Yorktown Waste Water Control Plant.

Councilman Bernard spoke about a fundraiser he attended for the organization United for the Troops. He also announced that the new owners of the Hilltop Service Station have received an Order to Remedy for removing landscaping and fencing that were part of the site plan for this parcel.

Councilman Diana announced that the Yorktown Citizens Task Force Against Heroin will resume their regular meetings at the Elks Club in January.

DURING REPORTS FROM WHITE PLAINS, Michael Kaplowitz, Chairman of the Westchester County Board of Legislators and representative for the 4th County Legislative District spoke about the upcoming budget which right now has a zero tax increase. He also stated that the request of the Town of Yorktown to expand the Peekskill Sanitary Sewer District to include certain parcels including COSTCO has been granted.

Heather O'Donnell, President of the John C. Hart Library Board of Directors told the Town Board that they had conducted an extensive search to find a replacement for Patricia Barresi, who served as Director of the Library and who retired several months ago. Mrs. O'Donnell stated that the Board of Trustees of the John C. Hart Library believe Patricia Hallinan who has worked for the Library for a number of years is the person best suited for the job.

Mrs. Mara Ziedens asked for additional traffic calming devices and a stepped up Police presence on Hallocks Mill Road.

Mr. Robert Giordano, head of the Yorktown Small Business Association spoke about a new program for small business that is modeled on the American Express Shop Small Business Saturday. American Express campaign is for one day, Saturday, November 28, 2015. The Yorktown Program will continue through the holidays. Merchants will be offering discounts as well as a way to enter a raffle.

Mr. Heller, a resident of Shrub Oak described the landscape and fencing that were removed from the Hilltop Service Station property. Mr. Heller further told the Town Board that he is also a business owner, but, that he tries to play by the rules. The new owner of this property should also be required to play by the rules.

Supervisor Grace stated that the owner of the property was in his office today and is looking to resolve the problem.

CONVENE PUBLIC HEARING

HOMES OF HISTORIC DISTINCTION PROGRAM – LANDMARKS PRESERVATION

Supervisor Grace convened the public hearing to consider a proposed local law to amend Chapter 198 of the Code of the Town of Yorktown entitled "LANDMARK PRESERVATION." To add a "Homes of Historic Distinction" Program. Affidavits of Posting and Publication were presented by the Town Clerk.

Mr. Jean Francois de Laperouse, Chairman of the Landmarks Preservation Commission spoke about the Town of Yorktown and the vast number of historic homes that were built in this community. Officially, the 14 homes and/or structure have received landmark status. The Landmarks Preservation Commission has come up with a new program called the Historic Distinction Program that recognizes the historic nature of a structure without giving it landmark status.

Mrs. Linda Briggs explained that during the 2010 Comprehensive Plan, an architectural firm identified more than 200 homes of "Notable Interest". The Landmarks Commission will contact the owners of these structures, but if anyone would like us to consider their home, they can either download the application from the Town's website or contact the Planning Department.

All those present having been given the opportunity to be heard and there being no further discussion. Upon motion made by Councilman Patel, seconded by Councilman Bernard and carried, the hearing was closed.

CONVENE PUBLIC HEARING

AMEND CHAPTER 275 – RESTRICTING PARKING ON LAUREL COURT AND ROCHAMBEAU DRIVE -TRAFFIC AND PARKING REGULATIONS

Supervisor Grace convened the public hearing to consider a proposed local law to amend Chapter 275 of the Code of the Town of Yorktown entitled "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC." Article 1, entitled "Traffic and Parking Regulations," restricting parking on Laurel Court and Rochambeau Drive. Affidavits of Posting and Publication were presented by the Town Clerk.

Mrs. Terry Zulkowsky, a resident of Hallocks Mill Road stated that she recognizes that safety is and should always be a concern of the Town. The biggest issue for people living in this area is the number of cars that speed through our neighborhood. Many of the people who live in this area have small driveways and it is necessary at times to park on Laurel Court. Mrs. Zulkowsky stated she believes that the one hundred foot requirement in this proposal is excessive.

Mr. Bob Zulkowsky stated that he believes if the Town reduced the footage requirement for parking along the road from one hundred feet down to fifty feet, than you will in addition to achieving your safety goal, it will also allow homeowners with smaller driveways to continue to park on Laurel Court.

Mrs. Geraldine Schwalb thanked the Town Board for following up on her concern regarding people parking along both sides of Rochambeau Court, but she says in addition to prohibiting parking, you should also prohibit standing.

Mrs. Isabel Kavanagh, who also lives in the area agrees that the law should also prohibit standing.

All those present having been given the opportunity to be heard and there being no further discussion. Upon motion by Supervisor Grace, seconded by Councilman Bernard and carried, the hearing was closed.

Reserve Decision.

RECONVENE PUBLIC HEARING REZONING REQUEST MADE BY MANDALAY BUILDERS AKA CROMPOND TERRACES

Supervisor Grace reconvened the public hearing to consider a request made by Mandalay Builders, LLC in connection with property known on the Yorktown Tax Rolls as Section, Parcel and lots 26.18-1-9, 26.18-1-10, 26.18-1-11, 26.18-1-12, 26.18-1-13, 26.18-1-14, 26.18-1-15, 26.18-1-16 for a Change of Zone from R1-20 to C2R and R-3.

Mrs. Ann Kutter, Project Manager introduced the members of the Mandalay Builders team including Engineer Dan Ciarcia, Planner Ann Cutignola, Environmental Engineer Steve Marino and Traffic Consultant Dr Philip Greeley, and Roy Baiata. She reviewed the project with the Town Board stating that the proposed rezoning will implement the recommendations of the

2010 Comprehensive Plan. Mrs. Kutter also stated that an EEAF (Expanded Environmental Assessment Form) was distributed to the involved and interested agencies on October 12, 2015.

Mr. Gary Ajello read prepared remarks, a copy of which is on file in the Town Clerks Office. Mr. Ajello, a former member of the Town Board stated that beginning with the 1955 Master Plan, this site, now known as the Bear Mountain Triangle was considered to be for non-residential purposes. The idea of developing this site for any other purposes did not come up until the 2010 Master Plan. He is against the proposal.

Mr. Ken Belfer, Chairman of the Yorktown Community Housing Board spoke in favor of this proposal.

Mr. Anthony Grasso who is also a former member of the Yorktown Town Board stated that tonight he was speaking on behalf of the Chamber who is in favor of the proposal.

Mrs. Geraldine Schwalb, a former Town Clerk stated that there was one flaw to Mr. Ajello's discussion. If former Town Board's agreed that this site should have been for non-residential purposes, why didn't they change the zone.

Mr. Edward Ciffone spoke in opposition to the plan.

Mr. Vincent Scotto, a resident of the Millpond area spoke about flooding issues in his area. What effect would this proposal have on his area?

Supervisor Grace explained that this proposal should have no effect on this area. What needs to happen to resolve the flooding issue in his area is for the State Land property to be developed.

Mr. William LaScala spoke in favor of the proposal stating that while it is good to look back onto history, ideas that were good fifty years ago, may not be so good today.

Ms. Ann Cutignola, a representative of Tim Miller Associates reiterated that this proposal meets the goals of the 2010 Comprehensive Plan.

Supervisor Grace read reports from the following agencies:

A joint memorandum from John Tegeder, the Director of Planning and Bruce Barber, Yorktown's Environmental Consultant dated November 17, 2015.

Supervisor Grace also read an email from Alfio Della Vecchia, one of the property owners in the area.

Councilwoman Siegel read a memorandum from the Planning Board dated November 17, 2015. She further indicated that according to the members of the Planning Board, they just received the EEAF in paper form.

The Town Clerk stated that they were sent this same document in CD format on October 12. 2015. The Planning Director later requested a paper version of the document for the members of the Planning Board.
