DURING REPORTS TO THE TOWN, Supervisor Grace stated that he has asked Planning Director John Tegeder to come this evening and do a presentation on the Downtown Revitalization Plan.

Planning Director John Tegeder gave a presentation on the Downtown Revitalization plan and the relocation plan for the Highway and Parks Department to the Greenwood Street site.

Supervisor Grace explained about the New York State Upstate Revitalization Grant Program and how the New York State Consolidated Funding Application works.

Councilwoman Siegel thanked Supervisor Grace for the presentation and asked if it can be done again during a meeting that is noticed for the Downtown Revitalization Plan and give others a chance to comment on the plan.

Councilman Patel asked to have the issue about the Downtown Revitalization Plan on the ballot for the people to decide.

Councilman Bernard stated that he did not feel this should be a contentious issue because the Town has not allotted any funds to the project except to use Town staff to do concept drawings on what this area could look like.
