National Purple Heart Day

WHEREAS, the Purple Heart Medal is awarded in the name of the President of the United States to members of the armed forces who are wounded or killed in action; and WHEREAS, the Purple Heart medal was first created by General George Washington and remains in the oldest military decoration in the world in present use; and

WHEREAS, the Purple Heart Medal was discontinued after the Revolutionary War but reinstated by the U.S. War Department on February 22, 1932, the 200th anniversary of George Washington's birthday; and

WHEREAS, nearly two million American soldiers who have been wounded in battle or killed in action have received this prestigious recognition for their bravery and valor; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper to take time to remember these heroes who fought for and protected our freedoms both at home and abroad; and

WHEREAS, on August 6, 2013 the Town of Yorktown declared itself a Purple Heart Town through a resolution as recommended by the Military Order of the Purple Heart Chapter 21; and

WHEREAS, the freedoms we cherish come at a price paid by the brave soldiers who stand watch every single day; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town of Yorktown recognizes August 7, 2022 as National Purple Heart Day; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town of Yorktown recognizes our residents who are recipients of the prestigious Purple Heart Award and thank them for their services; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town of Yorktown recommits itself as a Purple Heart Town.
