TREE ORDINANCE LOCAL LAW #16 OF 2010 RESOLUTION #572

Upon motion made by Supervisor Siegel, seconded by Councilman Bianco,

Councilman Bianco stated that he supports this legislation and will be voting in favor of it tonight.

Councilman Patel also expressed his support for the legislation and will also be voting aye.

Councilman Murphy began his discussion by thanking Mrs. Kutter and Mrs. Miller and the Tree Commission for drafting this legislation. He further stated that he cannot support the legislation. He has been on both sides of this issue and has received too many telephone calls from residents who do not want to see this legislation go into effect.

Councilman Martorano stated that he had mixed feelings about this proposal for a number of reasons. He believes that the government is passing too many laws. But, he believes that the greatest legacy that this board will leave is one of environmental conservation. The Councilman was happy to see the flow chart. He will be voting in favor of the law.

Supervisor Siegel thanked Mrs. Kutter, Mrs. Miller and the Tree Commission for their work on this legislation. This law protects the function of trees. It is not restrictive for homeowners. It is not retroactive. It will not go into effect for sixty (60) days.

WHEREAS, a public hearing was reconvened on December 7, 2010, pursuant to notice duly published as required by law to hearing to repeal and reenact chapter 270 of the Code of the Town of Yorktown entitled "TREES," relating to establishing a program for the preservation, protection and maintenance of the individual trees and the Yorktown Forest, Amend Chapter 10, Article VIII Section 10-26. Amend Chapter 165, Section 165-7. Amend Chapter 178, Section 178-9. Amend Chapter 195- Section 195-15, Section 195-25, Section 195-26, Section 195.40. Now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that Local Law #16/2010, as annexed hereto, be and is hereby adopted.

### B. Approval of a 3% rent hike

There was discussion concerning the way the rent is levied. Councilman Murphy asked if the tenants were told that a 3% rent hike was on the way. Supervisor Siegel stated that they know every year, the Town raises their rent in January. In fact, one tenant, Bright Beginnings has sent a letter requesting no rent hike. Councilman Bianco stated that he doesn't want to raise their rent either, but the Town runs this building on a deficit and the cost of oil to heat the building has risen since last year. The Town of Yorktown pays all of the utilities.

Councilman Murphy stated that he wants the Town to have a discussion with these tenants before any rent hike goes into effect.

Supervisor Siegel asked if we postponed the increases to February, would that work.

Councilman Murphy responded yes.

Councilman Patel stated that he voted no for this resolution because the rents are not fair and equitable for all.

Councilman Martorano stated that he doesn't believe that the Town should be charging any non profit company. He further stated that he doesn't think we should be increasing anyone's rent because these are tough times.

### GARBAGE CONSULTANT RFP RESOLUTION #575

Upon motion made by Councilman Martorano, seconded by Councilman Bianco,

Supervisor Siegel explained that the current garbage contract expires at the end of 2011. We would like to send out a Request for Proposal (RFP) to Garbage Consultants who will work with the Town on a bid document for next year. She also stated that we would like them to consider one pickup per week as well as the current two pickups per week.

The majority of the Town Board did not want to pursue any change to the way garbage is picked up. The Board asked that all information regarding a one day a week pick up be removed from the RFP before it is sent out.

Upon Motion by Councilman Bianco, seconded by Councilman Murphy RESOLVED, the Superintendent of Environmental Conservation is authorized to send out a Request for Proposals (RFP) for a Garbage Consultant

Siegel, Bianco, Martorano, Murphy, Patel Voting Aye Resolution adopted.

#### SHALLOW CREEK RFP

Councilman Murphy recused himself from this discussion and left the room.

Supervisor Siegel stated that the Recreation Department would like to send out a Request for Proposals for a recreational use of the property.

Councilman Bianco stated that he would like to see this discussion tabled. Right now youngsters are using the property as practice fields and until the fields on the Granite Knoll property are completed, we need to allow them to use these fields.

Supervisor Siegel stated that sending this RFP out now would have no effect on using Shallow Creek as practice fields.

Councilman Martorano agreed with Councilman Bianco that the discussion should be tabled while the kids use the fields.

Councilman Patel stated that this is a good proposal and could bring revenue into the Town of Yorktown.

The Town Clerk advised the Board that there was no majority, so a vote was not possible.

Councilman Murphy returned to the table.

### EXECUTIVE SESSION

Councilman Martorano motioned, seconded by Councilman Murphy, to move into Executive Session to discuss possible litigation.

Councilman Martorano motioned, seconded by Councilman Bianco, to move out of Executive Session and return to the work session.

### **BERNSTEIN PROPERTY**

Mr. William Primavera, Mr. Chris Scherra and Mr. Ken Belfer joined the Town Board for a discussion on a proposal their handout calls "A Best Case Scenario for the Adams-Bernstein Property" a copy of which is also on file under Town Board Minute Handouts.

The members of the Town Board listened as Mr. Primavera and Mr. Scherra's plan to develop the site was described by the Supervisor.

Mr. Scherra added that he has since learned that it is possible to construct sewers on this piece of property.

Supervisor Siegel explained that the Town could not participate in the type of program described in the handout. But, she is looking at other properties that the Town of Yorktown owns and will probably include the Bernstein House in the next auction sometime next year.

Mr. Primavera expressed his disappointment and stated that this type of project could have brought new business to Yorktown. He further stated that businesses have told him that they do not feel welcome in Yorktown.

Councilman Bianco asked him which businesses he was talking about. He further stated that he would just like to sell the property.

Mr. Ken Belfer, Chairman of the Yorktown Community Housing Board stated that he had been in contact with Norma Drummond, the person in charge of Westchester County's Affordable Housing Program. If the Town was to sell the Bernstein House to Westchester County, all you Yorktown would receive is what you have paid out on the house. Since the house was a donation, all you would receive is your maintenance costs. He suggested that Mr. Primavera contact Westchester County directly.

#### 2011 BUDGET DISCUSSSION

Supervisor Siegel provided the Town Board with answers to 11 questions posed by the Public at the Budget Hearing, a copy of which is on file in the 2011 Preliminary Budget Book on file in the Town Clerk's Office.

The Town Clerk spoke about questions posed about the Bingo Inspector. She introduced, Jane Fisher who is the Bingo Inspector. Mrs. Roker stated that after her former Bingo Inspector retired, she received calls from a State Agent from the New York State Racing and Wagering Board on a regular basis concerning questions and problems at one of the sites holding Bingo games. Since, Mrs. Fisher took over as Bingo Inspector, the Town Clerk's Office has not received any complaints from the State's Wagering and Gaming Board.

The Town has 109 telephones. 69 have full service. 40 are walkie-talkies. We pay \$25 per month for blocks of time.

Unused funds – The numbers in the budget reflect what was paid up until November 30, 2010. The Finance Department is still paying October bills, there is a 60 day lapse.

Live Scan – The cost of the equipment was \$26,935. The grant that the Police Department received totaled \$17,382. The funds for equipment in 2011 will pay for a new phone recorder and 2 new cars.

The 2010 Contingency Line was spent on items that were not budgeted or underbudgeted. \$150,000 in legal expenses and a retirement pay out of \$52,000.

The Legal Research line went up because the former Town Attorney signed a contract for \$750.00 per month. The subscription cannot be shared with the Library. Our new Town Attorney will look into getting a better deal.

There is nothing current in the contingency line for 2011. We will have to take money from the Fund Balance.

Supervisor explained that our auditors told us that we had to sign contracts with the clubs to cover the cost of umpires, balls and custodial charges. If the Town had to pay employees to do what the Sports Club volunteers do, then we would have to hire additional staff.

The Town has bottled drinking water because the State Building Code requires all public buildings to have drinking fountains. It's cheaper to have bottled water than to have to build drinking fountains.

Opening the YCCC on Sundays – The figure that Mr. Liebman gave to open the Yorktown Community and Cultural Center on Sundays is incorrect. We calculate a blended rate of \$75 per hour. Right now, the rent we charge him for Yorktown Stage is \$1,850.00 which is well below market rate. The Town of Yorktown paid for a number of items in the theatre including; new seats, we had the drapes fire proofed and installed a new sprinkler system.

There was discussion from several members of the Town Board regarding having a Westchester County Police Officer serve as a School Resource Officer in Yorktown. Supervisor Siegel stated that the services are not equal. The SRO in Lakeland doesn't start when the school year begins and he ends before the last day of school. Further, if the Westchester County School Resource Officer is sick or on vacation, he is not replaced. Supervisor Siegel stated that if the Yorktown SRO is sick or on vacation he or she is replaced. So, we are comparing apples to oranges.

Councilman Bianco asked the Comptroller what she thought the Fund Balance would be at the end of the year, she stated it would be \$1,500,000.

He told her he believed the figure would be \$1,900,000, which is 8% of the budget.

There was a discussion concerning additional money that had to be paid out in connection with the Jefferson Valley Sidewalk Project.

Highway Superintendent DiBartolo stated that the money for this project would not be coming from the Town of Yorktown. Westchester County owes the Town of Yorktown \$414,000 for taking over its roads. The work done in this area can be covered with this money.

The Comptroller said if the County would be paying the additional cost of the sidewalk project, then the Fund Balance would probably be \$1,900,000. Mrs. Goldberg also spoke about an \$8.3 million bond anticipation note. Next week, she'll be closing on a \$10 million dollar ban with a 1 and a quarter percent interest rate. She also stated that she is not sure the Town has to pay for the cooling tower. The contractor destroyed it, so she wants to hold his insurance company liable for the replacement.

Councilman Bianco stated that he would like to vote on the budget with two additions.

Upon motion made by Councilman Bianco, seconded by Councilman Martorano,

Approve an additional \$2,000 to the Auxiliary Police line to pay the costs for a volunteer police officer.

Supervisor Siegel stated that she is fully supportive of the Auxiliary Police, but as she has told so many department heads, we just cannot afford to pay for this.

Bianco, Martorano, Murphy, Patel Voting Aye Siegel voting Nay Resolution adopted.

Upon motion made by Councilman Bianco, seconded by Councilman Martorano,

Approve an additional \$3,000 to pay the salary of Cary Vigilante for six months.

Supervisor once again stated that she cannot agree to additional expenditures when she has turned down all requests from her department heads.

Bianco, Martorano, Murphy, Patel Voting Aye Siegel voting Nay Resolution adopted.

Upon motion made by Councilman Murphy, seconded by Councilman Martorano,

Approve an additional \$8,000 to continue Frederick Gauthier as General Foreman in the Highway Department.

Supervisor Siegel stated that this was a recommendation from the Highway Superintendent.

Councilman Bianco stated that he would agree with whatever the Highway Superintendent wanted to do with positions in his department.

Martorano, Murphy Voting Aye Siegel, Bianco, Patel Voting Nay Resolution defeated

Upon Motion made by Councilman Patel, seconded by Supervisor Siegel,

Remove \$150,000 of Fund Balance money from the Preliminary Budget.

Siegel, Patel, Voting Aye Bianco, Murphy, Martorano voting Nay Resolution defeated

Councilman Murphy stated that it is now time for Yorktown to open up its doors to businesses and look for new revenue sources.

Councilman Martorano stated that ten positions have been eliminated from the budget which means that it will have to rely on its employees to do more with less.

Councilman Patel stating that not restoring the \$150,000 to the fund balance is wrong, but he will support the budget.

Supervisor Siegel stated that she will be voting for the budget, but with a lot of reservations.

Councilman Bianco thanked the Comptroller and her department as well as the Supervisor for their hard work on the budget. He believes this is a budget that taxpayers can afford. The tax increase will be approximately 1.4% increase for residents with utilities which is lower than the increase in the cost of living which is about 2%.
