PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Matthew Lewin, a Boy Scout with Troop 165 led the salute to the flag.

MOMENT OF SILENCE

A moment of silence was observed in honor of our men and women serving in the Armed Forces.

STATE SENATOR GREGORY BALL

PRESENTATION

Surrounded by Brian Gray, the Yorktown Parks and Recreation Superintendent, Steven Rosen, of the Shrub Oak Athletic Club, Senator Ball presented a facsimile of a check for \$150,000 to the Town Board to be used for recreation purposes.

Senator Ball stated that he is working closely with the Town Board and will try to find state funding for other projects such as the Economic Revitalization of the Route 202 corridor.

DURING THE SUPERVISOR'S REPORT TO THE TOWN

Supervisor Grace thanked Senator Ball for his help in getting funding for town projects. He spoke about getting a small grant to begin a Phase 11 Environmental Assessment of the property that houses the Highway Garage. Supervisor Grace stated that what the Town would like to do is move the Highway Garage to the town property which already houses the Yorktown Sewer Plant. We would free up a valuable piece of property on Front Street and return it to the tax rolls. The Town hopes to build a state of the art Highway Garage utilizing green technology and allowing the methane created by the sewer plant to heat the building. Supervisor Grace also spoke about the Route 202 Economic Revitalization Project, the redevelopment of the Jefferson Valley Mall and a medical building in Jefferson Valley. Supervisor Grace further stated that the 2012 9-11 Ceremony will be held at the 9-11 Monument in Shrub Oak. The Grange Fair opens this week. There will be a Tractor Parade on Saturday morning.

DURING REPORTS FROM TOWN BOARD MEMBERS

Councilman Bianco stated that the Tax Department sent out the 2012 tax bills earlier today. The Yorktown Central School District's bills rose by 1.9%. Lakeland School District's tax bills went up 2.5%. Councilman Bianco explained that Lakeland is different from the Yorktown Central School District; 98% of the district is in the Town of Yorktown. Lakeland School District is comprised of six towns spanning two counties. Depending on where you live, the rate hike over the last five years could be as little as nine percent or as high as 42%.

Town Clerk Alice Roker spoke about the upcoming primary. This is for people enrolled in the Republican, Conservative and Green Parties. The Board of Elections has changed several polling places including Brookside School and Crompond School, both of which have been moved to the French Hill School. Election Districts formerly housed at St. Mary's Church on Route 202 have been moved to the Lake Mohegan Fire House on Route 6.

Councilman Terrence Murphy introduced Mr. Ed Ackerman.

Mr. Ackerman spoke about a Fund Raiser on September 23rd. The proceeds will go to the Luskgarten Foundation to help fight pancreatic cancer.

Councilman Patel thanked everyone who attended the Memorial for Army Specialist David R. Fahey who died while serving his country in Afghanistan. The Councilman thanked Senator Ball for his recent Business Council Meeting. Councilman Patel also spoke about a project at Yorktown High School involving a LEGO robot.

Councilman Pagnelli spoke about the influx of new businesses into the area including Pizza Hut and TCBY. I HOP (the International House of Pancakes) is expected to open later this month.

Mr. Jack Mota, a resident of Quinlan Street read from a prepared statement, explaining that he and his wife bought their home three years ago and because it was on a busy street, and they have two little girls, they were happy to see speed bumps. After his family moved into their new home, the speed bumps were removed. He asked the Town Board to take a look at this issue because not having something to slow the cars and truck down poses a safety hazard.

Supervisor Grace stated that Councilman Murphy and Larry Eidelman, the members of the Traffic Safety Committee will make a site visit and speak to the neighbors.

PUBLIC HEARING – PROPOSED LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 300 – ARTICLE X TO ALLOW RECYCLING AS A PERMITTED MAIN USE IN THE I-1 PLANNED LIGHT INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT

Supervisor Grace convened the public hearing to consider a proposed local law to amend Chapter 300 of the Code of the Town of Yorktown entitled "ZONING" with respect to Article V entitled "Schedule of Regulations," to allow recycling as a permitted manufacturing use in the I-1 Planned Light Industrial District.

Supervisor explained that this is a change to the zoning text to permit this type of industry.

Mr. Albert Capellini explained that this change will only effect two areas in Yorktown which are industrial zones; Front Street and Navajo Road.

Supervisor Grace stated that the recycling industry is very profitable and necessary.

Councilman Bianco read memorandum from the Conservation Board, Westchester County's Planning Department and ABACA who had no concerns with the text change. The Planning Board in its memorandum asked for changes to the text which have been made. Councilman Bianco agreed with Supervisor Grace that this type of change to the code is necessary.

Mr. Howard Frank, a 52 year resident of the Town of Yorktown questioned whether this type of industry would be good for Yorktown. He stated that there could be a big problem with dusk. There will be a need for a structural engineer to insure that the site will be able to hold the equipment necessary for this industry.

Supervisor Grace explained that this was a text change, if a recycling facility is built in Yorktown, those are the types of issues that can be raised during a review of a site plan.

All those present having been given the opportunity to be heard and there being no further discussion the hearing was closed. Councilman Bianco motioned, seconded by Councilman Murphy.

WHEREAS, the Town entered into a Lease Agreement with Sprint Spectrum L.P. permitting the erection and maintenance of a cell tower on Town-owned property at Woodland Avenue a/k/a Heyward Street (Tax Map Section 15.16, Block 3, Lot 32 which was amended by a Lease Amendment dated January 20, 1998; a Second Amendment to PCS Site Agreement dated October 11, 2006; and a Third Amendment to PCS Site Agreement dated December 30, 2009 (as amended, the "Lease Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Town and Sprint Spectrum L.P.'s successor-in-interest, STC Five LLC, wish to amend the Lease Agreement to relocate the leased area for the municipal purpose of facilitating maintenance of Water Department facilities at that location, and to permit STC Five LLC to increase the height of the cell tower from 133 feet to 140 feet; and

WHEREAS Town Law § 64 requires that the Town's lease of real property be subject to a permissive referendum;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town has determined the action contemplated under this Resolution is a Type II action under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQR") and therefore no further review is required under SEQR; and be it further

RESOLVED that the Town Supervisor is authorized to enter into a Fourth Amendment to PCS Site Agreement ("Fourth Amendment") with STC Five LLC for the purposes described above, all other terms of the Lease Agreement to remain unchanged; and be it further

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Town Law, within ten (10) days from the date of this Resolution the Town Clerk shall post and publish a notice which shall set forth the date of the adoption of the Resolution, shall contain an abstract of such Resolution concisely setting forth the purpose and effect thereof, shall specify that this Resolution was adopted subject to a permissive referendum; and shall publish such notice in the Journal News, a newspaper published in the County having a general circulation in the Town of Yorktown, and in addition thereto that the Town Clerk shall post or cause to be posted on the sign-board of the Town of Yorktown, a copy of such notice within ten (10) days after the date of the adoption of this Resolution.
