#### DURING REPORTS FROM THE TOWN BOARD

Councilman Bianco announced that on May 5<sup>th</sup>, Relay for Life will be holding a "Historic House Tour" in the Town of Yorktown.

Councilman Murphy thanked Bruce Adler and CJ Divens for opening their Sports Dome to youngsters who are members of the Yorktown Athletic Club when there were no other fields available.

Supervisor Grace announced that the Town passed its Storm Water Management Inspection. Officials from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation toured a number of sites including the ball fields owned by CJ Divens and Bruce Adler.

Councilman Patel spoke about the luncheon at the Knights of Columbus that he and Supervisor Grace attended. He also announced that he will be going to the Dinner Dance celebrating the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Yorktown Ambulance Corp.

Councilman Patel asked Supervisor to make the presentation of a Certificate of Merit to Joseph Cirone, President of the LEOs.

Supervisor Grace stated that on behalf of the Town Board he was honored to be handing this Certificate to the LEOs, a group of young people who are and have been so vital to this community.

Mr. Gregory Kravtsov, read portions of a two page letter, a copy of which is on file in the Town Clerk's Office; the letter outlines what he calls "Unfair Taxation of Destroyed Property Value."

Mr. Paul Moskowitz, representing SMART GROWTH spoke about the group's 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Dinner Dance on Saturday, April 13, 2013 at Traveler's Rest.

Mr. Anthony Grasso spoke about an unfortunate occurrence at his church, St. Patrick's Catholic Church last Sunday. He did not like the fact that a Councilman showed up on Easter Sunday to shake hands.

Mrs. Ann Kutter had complaints about the new garbage hauler, Competition Carting.

Supervisor Grace explained that the Town is working with the company to address everyone's concerns.

Mr. George Hanson also had an issue concerning the garbage company and what the Town tells the residents to do if they have a problem. Mr. Hanson stated that he called the Refuse and Recycling Department; on the message it says if your complaint is about garbage, call Competition Carting. He wanted to know who was watching the store, if a resident follows what the message says, Town will never know there was a complaint.

Mrs. Kim Angliss-Gage, Coordinator of Refuse and Recycling stated that Mr. Hanson is correct, that is what the voice mail says, but, some people choose to hold on the line and speak to someone in my department. They will make the telephone call to Competition Carting if the resident asks.

#### PRESENTATION - BATTLE OF YORKTOWN

Mrs. Kim Angliss-Gage explained that April 20, 2013 marks the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Battle of Yorktown, our war on roadside litter. Last year more than 677 volunteers collected nearly 13 tons of litter.

Mrs. Angliss-Gage spoke about a disturbing trend her department is forced to deal with. People are pilfering through electronic devices when they are put on the road for a bulk trash pickup. This presents a major hazard to the members of her staff and it is for that reason, we're asking the Town Board to allow us to collect electronic materials at our office.

## REQUEST FOR RELIEF FROM THE CONDITIONS IMPOSED BY A REZONING ON JUNE 4, 1991

Supervisor Grace convened the public hearing to consider amending the conditions placed on the rezoning of a 2.44 acre parcel located on Crompond Road, owned by Boniello Construction and Realty Company on June 4, 1991. Affidavits of Posting and Publication were presented by the Town Clerk.

Supervisor Grace provided the background on this issue; this property was rezoned in 1991, at that time the Town was very active in creating affordable housing, the property owner was given a density bonus, the resolution granting the rezoning permitted 14 units to be built on this 2.44 acre site. The resolution also required the property owner to hook those units into sewers. Today, the Affordable Housing Law has been changed and the sewer moratorium is still in effect. The property owner has been waiting more than twenty years to build at this site. He is requesting relief from these conditions.

Councilman Nicholas Bianco read recommendations from the Westchester Planning Department, the Yorktown Planning Department and the Conservation Board, none of which saw a problem with granting the relief that is requested.

Mr. Ray Arnold stated that his recommendation states that the rezoning was never done by local law.

The Board members acknowledged that statement saying that we are holding a public hearing and will resolve this issue with a resolution, since it was rezoned via a public hearing and a subsequent resolution.

Mr. Ken Belfer, Chairman of the Yorktown Housing Board agreed that this property owner has unfairly been caught in this sewer moratorium. The Housing Board visited the site. They were surprised at the number of units the property owner was given. The Housing Board regrets the loss of these affordable units.

All those present having been given the opportunity to be heard and there being no further discussion, the hearing was closed. Councilman Bianco motioned, seconded by Councilman Murphy.

## BONIELLO CONSTRUCTION & REALTY INC. REQUEST FOR RELIEF FROM THE CONDITIONS IMPOSED BY A REZONING ON JUNE 4, 1991 – SEQRA FINDINGS RESOLUTION #149

WHEREAS, in or about 1991, Boniello Construction and Realty, Inc. (the "Owner"), owner of a 2.44 acre parcel on Crompond Road, consisting of three tax lots having the following tax map identification numbers (SBL): 37.09-1-67, 37.09-1-70, and 37.09-1-71 (collectively referred to herein as the "Property"), applied for a change in zoning classification from an R1-20 district (single-family residential) to an R-2 (multi-family) district; and

WHEREAS, the 1991 rezoning was further conditioned upon the developer connecting the multi-family units planned for the Property to public sewers and making right-turn traffic improvements on Crompond Road; and

WHEREAS, the Town's Affordable Housing Law in effect in 1991 was subsequently repealed and the sewer moratorium that was imposed on the Town by New York City Department of Environmental Protection in 1988 was never lifted and remains in effect as of the date of this resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Owner has applied to the Town Board for a modification to the June 4, 1991 resolution to remove the conditions and requirements that as of the date of this resolution the Owner cannot lawfully comply with; and

WHEREAS, on March 15, 2013, the Town Board declared itself lead agency for the purpose of reviewing the environmental impact of the proposed action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act; and

WHEREAS, on that date, the Town Board referred the proposed action out to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, the New York City Department of Environmental Protection, the New York State Department of Transportation, the Westchester County Planning Department/Board, the Westchester County Health Department, and the following Yorktown agencies: Assessor, Conservation Board, Planning Department/Planning Board, Town Attorney, Town Engineer, and the Wetlands Inspector; and scheduled a public hearing for April 2, 2013; and

WHEREAS, comments were received from the Town Planning Board and the Conservation Board stating that these boards had no objection to the proposed action, and a public hearing was held on April 2, 2013 at which public testimony was received;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Town Board finds the proposed action is an Unlisted Action under SEQRA and upon consideration of a short form EAF and the testimony at the April 2, 2013 hearing hereby issues a negative declaration under Part 617 of SEQRA; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby amends the Resolution passed on June 4, 1991 in which the Property was rezoned to R-2, by removing all of the conditions to which said rezoning was made subject.
