Regular meeting held by the Town Board, Town of Yorktown on September 21, 2010 held at Yorktown Town Hall, Yorktown Heights, NY.

TOWN BOARD MEETING

Supervisor Susan Siegel called the meeting to order. Town Attorney Jeannette Koster, was also present.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Supervisor Siegel led the salute to the flag.

MOMENT OF SILENCE

A moment of silence was observed in honor of our men and women serving in the Armed Forces.

DURING THE SUPERVISOR'S REPORT TO THE TOWN, Supervisor Siegel spoke about the last Town Board meeting where we had a lengthy public hearing regarding our proposed Tree Legislation. All of the remarks to the proposed local law will be discussed at next week's work session. If the Town Board agrees to incorporate all of the comments that we have received, a revised version of the law will be posted on the town's website and the public hearing will resume on October 5th. The Town Board is moving forward with its decision to purchase Granite Knolls. The Town is also moving forward with its Senior Citizen Computer Instruction Center at the Yorktown Community and Cultural Center. The Town will be holding an auction on September 29th at the Town Hall. We will be selling eleven properties currently owned by the Town of Yorktown. Two of these parcels have homes on them, two are possible building lots. The auctioneer will hold a seminar for bidders on September 27th in Town Hall. The Town has added two new companies to its Adopt-a-road Program. Primavera Homes adopted a portion of Gomer Street. STADS adopted a portion of East Main Street in Shrub Oak. The Town Hall will host a doctor who will provide flu shots to the community on October 7th from 9:00-11:00AM and then from 4:00PM to 6:00PM. The cost of the shot is \$30.00. October 6, 2010, Teatown Lake Reservation will be opening a new trail that runs from Kitchawan Park to Teatown Lake Reservation. Supervisor Siegel also spoke about damage done to the Patriot Skate Park over the weekend. She provided pictures of the damage to the members of the Town Board. Supervisor Siegel stated that she hopes to get together with the parents of some of the children who use the park. The Town Board will be discussing new skateboard legislation at its work session next week.

DURING THE TOWN COUNCIL'S REPORT TO THE TOWN, Councilman Patel stated that more than 20,000 people attended this year's Grange Fair. He attended a ceremony sponsored by the Knights of Columbus. Joseph Visconti, the President of the New Yorktown Chamber of Commerce and Supervisor Siegel were the honorees. The Field Home will celebrate their 130th anniversary this weekend with a Fall Festival on Saturday.

Councilman Murphy spoke about the Chamber of Commerce's Harvest Festival on October $9^{\text{th.}}$

Supervisor Siegel is investigating on-line tax payments. The Finance Department has been in touch with several companies.

PRESENTATION

Yorktown Fire Inspector Edward Kolisz stated that he is a resident of the Town of Yorktown. He and his wife are the parents of two children. He has worked as a Fire Inspector for 11 years. The Town of Yorktown has more than one thousand commercial properties that need to be inspected. Every property is required to be inspected at least once every three years; others are required to be inspected annually. Mr. Kolisz stated that his goal is to get compliance through education, not the courts.

COURTESY OF THE FLOOR

During Courtesy of the Floor, the following people addressed the members of the Town Board:

Carl Anderson, a member of the Yorktown Lions announced that the Lions Clubs around the world are conducting a Poster Contest. This is a contest open to youngsters in Middle School. The theme this year is "Voice of Peace". The winning entry will go on display at Town Hall. The winner will also receive a savings bond for \$100. The poster will then go on to be judged at the regional, state and international levels. Last year's winner was from Taiwan.

Mr. Mark Lieberman, the owner of Bark Busters spoke on behalf of the Yorktown Dog Park. He stated that a recent study shows that 76% of households own at least one dog. Mr. Lieberman further stated that everyone from skateboarders to softball players have a park. Why not dogs? They are safe settings for dogs. There are dog parks in the Town of Cortlandt, Putnam Valley, the Town of Rye and the Village of Sleepy Hollow.

Mrs. MaryAnn Baldwin also spoke on behalf of the Yorktown Dog Park Association. She wanted to know if anyone has followed up with the Fire Chief to see whether he has sent details of the controlled burn to New York State?

A member of Temple Beth Am spoke about their planned Vigil at Town Hall on October 4th to increase awareness of domestic violence which affects 75% of people in the United States. This vigil gives hope to survivors.

Mrs. Tricey Kushner, a member of the Board of Directors of the Alliance for Safe Kids spoke about some of her organization's upcoming events including the Iron Chef Barbe-cue on October 2nd at the Grange Fair and Teen Dance Night on Friday October 22nd. ASK has also partnered with the Yorktown Police Department. We have an anonymous hotline where teens can call if they hear or know of any dangerous or illegal activity. Westchester County has designated Monday, October 27th, as Family Night where we hope families will sit down and eat dinner together and re-connect.

COURTESY OF THE FLOOR IS CLOSED

Supervisor Siegel responded to some of the comments by stating:

Regarding the questions about the dog park, the Supervisor stated that she did speak to someone in New York State at the end of August. She was told that the Town needed to get more information about this controlled burn. The Yorktown Fire Chief has sent us the information that we needed. Jennifer Fava, the Yorktown Parks and Recreation Superintendent will be sending that information up to New York State as soon as she completes her budget.

PUBLIC HEARING

PROPOSED LOCAL LAW REPEALING CHAPTER 168 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF YORKTOWN ENTITLED "FEES", AMENDING VAROUIS OTHER SECTIONS OF THE CODE RELATING TO LAND DEVELOPMENT APPLICATION FEES AND PERMIT FEES AND RE-ENACTING A CHAPTER 168, ENTITLED MASTER FEE LAW

Supervisor Siegel reconvened the public hearing to consider repealing Chapter 168 of the Code of the Town of Yorktown entitled "FEES", amending various other Sections of the Code of the Town of Yorktown relating to Land Development application fees and permit

fees and re-enacting a Chapter 168 entitled "Master Fee Law." Affidavits of Posting and Publication were presented by the Town Clerk.

Supervisor Siegel explained that the law had two purposes; to consolidate all of the fees regarding land development into one section of the code and to save the taxpayers money.

Supervisor Siegel explained that the former Town Board decided to use one full time in-house Town Attorney and to use an outside legal firm to provide legal assistance to the Planning and Zoning Boards. The Supervisor explained that there are times when these attorneys are asked to do more. We do not have legislation that would enable us to charge the extra work to the applicant. Right now, the applicants owe the taxpayers \$115,132 for extra legal services associated with the planning process.

There are two schools of thought on this issue; some feel the tax payer should not be burdened with this cost. Others are concerned that this could become an open ended process. There are mechanisms within the proposed law that would require the attorney to go back to the approval authority for authorization if they feel additional work is needed.

As an example, the Supervisor stated that a site plan for a subdivision would start out with a \$500 escrow account. As the applicant moved through the process, the account would be drawn down. If there was money in the account at the end of the process, it would be refunded to the applicant.

Supervisor Siegel noted that a \$15.00 Administrative Fee for Tree Removals is on the list of fees. This will go or stay depending upon what the Town Board does with the proposed law on trees.

All those present having been given the opportunity to be heard and there being no further discussion, upon motion made by Councilman Murphy, seconded by Councilman Patel, the hearing was adjourned.

Supervisor Siegel explained that these bridges were cited by the New York State Department of Transportation as needing work.

The estimate we received was if we did it in-house the cost would be \$42,000. The cost for an outside vendor would be \$104,000. That represents a \$62,000 savings. The Town Board will have to sit with the Highway Superintendent for a discussion on this issue. Depending upon what we decide, that will affect the design work.

Supervisor Siegel explained that auditors from the New York State Comptroller's Office has stated that our purchasing policy does not meet state guidelines. This proposed new policy will clear up our deficiencies.

The following policy establishing internal procedures for the procurement of all goods and services by the Town of Yorktown is intended to implement the provisions of Sections 103 and 104-b of General Municipal Law, assure the prudent and economical use of public moneys in the best interests of the taxpayers, facilitate the acquisition of goods of services of maximum quality at the lowest possible cost, and guard against favoritism, extravagance, fraud and corruption.

I. Requisitions/Purchase Orders

All purchases are to be made using the Town of Yorktown's Requisition/Purchase Order system that encumbers the funds from budget appropriations prior to the actual purchase of the goods or services.

Requisitions are to be prepared by each department on the Town of Yorktown Requisition Form (**Attachment #1**) and submitted to the Comptroller's Office. The Comptroller's Office will create the purchase order and return it to the department as authorization to place the order. Requisitions to an expense code line that is over budget, or which will cause the expense line to go over budget, will not be processed unless and until an appropriate budget transfer has been approved, either by the Supervisor for transfer requests up to \$10,000 or by the Town Board for transfer requests exceeding \$10,000.

Any requisitions received by the Comptroller's Office that do not have the appropriate backup documentation as required by this policy will be returned to the department for compliance, and no purchase order will be created until required backup documentation has been submitted.

Invoices will not be processed if they predate the purchase order. Orders placed prior to the approval process as set forth above may result in the purchase not being paid by the Town.

Requests to pay invoices must be accompanied by the original purchase order, an original invoice and, where applicable, a packing slip signed and dated by the employee responsible for physically receiving the materials, supplies, equipment or overseeing the service and/or repair.

The competitive bidding/pricing guidelines set forth below refer to annual cumulative purchases for each type of product. All purchases should be evaluated to determine whether, over the course of the fiscal year, the Town as a whole will spend in excess of the competitive bidding thresholds for the same or similar items or services. Split purchases to avoid compliance with the purchasing policy are expressly prohibited and may not be processed. Prior years' budgetary appropriations should be referred to for this information and compared with current projections. If two departments are bidding for the same goods or service, they should do so collectively whenever possible.

Vouchers are to be used only for emergency purchases of goods or services for which the department has secured emergency authorization.

II. Purchases subject to competitive bidding and/or competitive pricing

* A public works purchase is defined as an improvement to a public facility that includes a charge for labor. Any public work project requires NYS prevailing wage certifications and compliance with all NYS Department of Labor regulations.

III. Additional required documentation

The following documentation must accompany all requisition forms:

- For a service, materials or supplies that are awarded by the Town Board as a result of a formal bid or RFP: a stamped copy of the Town Board Resolution awarding the contract and a copy of the signed contract
- For an item purchased off a State/County Contract: a copy of the Contract or Contract pages referencing the pricing
- For requisitions that require written price quotes: copies of the price quotes secured.

If the purchase of goods or services is awarded to other than the lowest responsible vendor or contractor submitting a complying bid or quote, the reasons why such award is being made and why it is in the best interest of the Town of Yorktown shall be included with the purchase records.

IV. Professional Services

Only the Town Board can contract for professional services. For the purpose of this policy, professional services shall be considered those services involving a specialized skill, training, expertise, knowledge, use of professional judgment or discretion and/or a high degree of creativity. Among the services covered under this exception are auditors, architects, attorneys, engineers, land surveyors, environmental consultants and insurance brokers.

The determination of whether a purchase falls under the professional services procurement guidelines shall be made by the Town Board on a case-by-case basis after examining the particular service to be acquired.

The purchase of professional services shall be subject to the following comparative pricing procedures in order to ensure that the Town is receiving the best possible price and also to avoid any appearance of favoritism toward a particular individual or firm.

Under \$3,000	Written quotes from two vendors
Over \$3,000	Written quotes from three vendors or RFP

In selecting the most appropriate individual or firm for a specific service, the Town Board will be guided by a combination of price, and the experience, knowledge, expertise and skills of the vendors.

If a department head recommends to the Town Board that a vendor be selected without adhering to the above comparative pricing requirements, the department head must submit a memo to the Town Board explaining why the selected provider should be awarded the contract in the absence of competition from similar firms. Reasons for not adhering to the comparative pricing requirement may include a vendor's existing familiarity with the Town, past history working for the Town, or possession of a particular skill or expertise that is related to the service that is being requested.

V. Items exempted from competitive bidding/pricing guidelines

A. Emergency purchases or services

For the purpose of this section, an emergency arises out of an accident or unforeseen condition or occurrence that threatens curtailment or terminates an essential service to the public, or a dangerous condition develops, affecting the life, health, safety or property of the Town or its inhabitants. The situation must require immediate attention, which cannot await competitive bidding.

Only the Supervisor, or in the absence of the Supervisor, the Deputy Supervisor, or in the absence of both, the Comptroller, can declare an emergency for the purposes of this policy.

Once an emergency has been declared, the appropriate department head is authorized to purchase directly the necessary supplies or services needed the remedy the situation. A written record of the circumstances surrounding the emergency shall be prepared and submitted to the Comptroller's office within 48 hours after the satisfactory resolution of the emergency. While mitigating the emergency situation, and to the extent possible and practical, the department head shall endeavor to abide as closely as possible to the procurement guidelines set forth in this policy.

B. Sole Source Purchases

This exemption applies to the procurement of goods or services where only one vendor can supply the commodity, technology and/or perform the services required and where there is no substantial equivalent. Procurement under this sole source exemption must be documented with the following explanations:

1. the unique nature of the requirement

- 2. the basis upon which it was determined that there is only one known vendor able to meet the need (i.e., the steps taken to identify potential competitors)
- 3. the basis upon which the cost was determined to be reasonable (i.e., a fair market price was inferred based upon the sole source provider's product catalogs, published price lists and the like.)

C. Goods purchased from agencies for the blind or severely handicapped, with appropriate documentation.

D. Goods purchased from correctional facilities, with appropriate documentation.

E. Goods purchased from, or through, another governmental agency, such as NYS or Westchester County Contracts, with appropriate documentation.

F. Goods purchased at auction, with appropriate documentation.

VI. Annual Review

This policy shall be reviewed annually by the Town Board at its organizational meeting or as soon thereafter as is reasonably practicable.

<u>APPROVE SEQRA DETERMINATION</u> <u>ACQUISITION – GRANITE KNOLLS PARCELS</u> <u>RESOLUTION # 426</u>

Upon motion made by Councilman Murphy, seconded by Councilman Patel,

WHEREAS the Town Board of the Town of Yorktown wishes to purchase two parcels of property on Stoney Street (a/k/a Stony Street), Yorktown, having tax map designations of Tax Map ID # 26.09-1-22 (approx. 72.76 acres) and 26.06-1-1 (125.4 acres), respectively, for the total price of \$2,700,000, from Alan H. Rothschild, as executor of the Estate of Hubert Bartzick, and Alan H. Rothschild as Successor Trustee of the Revocable Trust Indenture, dated the 8th Day of August, 1989 Made by and between Hurbert Bartzick (Settlor and Trustee), Alan H. Rothschild (First Alternate Trustee) and Norman Himmelfarb (Second Alternate Trustee), to be funded from the Open Space Fund; and

WHEREAS an acquisition of real property of more than 100 acres is a Type I action under SEQR; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board, being the sole approval authority, is lead agency by operation of law; and

WHEREAS, a full Environmental Assessment Form (EAF) has been prepared by the Town Planning Department and has been reviewed and fully considered by the Town Board; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board finds that the acquisition of the two parcels contemplated herein will have no significant adverse impacts upon the environment;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Town Board adopts a Negative Declaration based on the full EAF; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the proposed acquisition of said two parcels is hereby authorized by the Town Board, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Board authorizes the Supervisor to enter into a contract for the purchase of said two parcels under the terms set forth in the resolutions dated April 20, 2010 as amended April, 27, 2010, and to enter into a contract for the purchase of title insurance from Benchmark Title Agency, LLC; and Be it FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Board intends to designate this site as parkland.

During Courtesy of the Floor, the following people addressed the members of the Town Board:

Highway Superintendent Eric DiBartolo stated that he had a problem with the bridge issue raised by the Supervisor earlier this evening. This has had an effect on his department's ability to complete their assignments. Mr. Frank we will ask that question of Algonquin Gas Company.

Mr. Moskowitz, the Town Board took several weeks off during the summer. She was asked to delay the continuance of the public hearing on Trees because of the absence of two board members. We have been working on the Stormwater and Illicit Discharge laws for several months. It just happened to work out this way.
